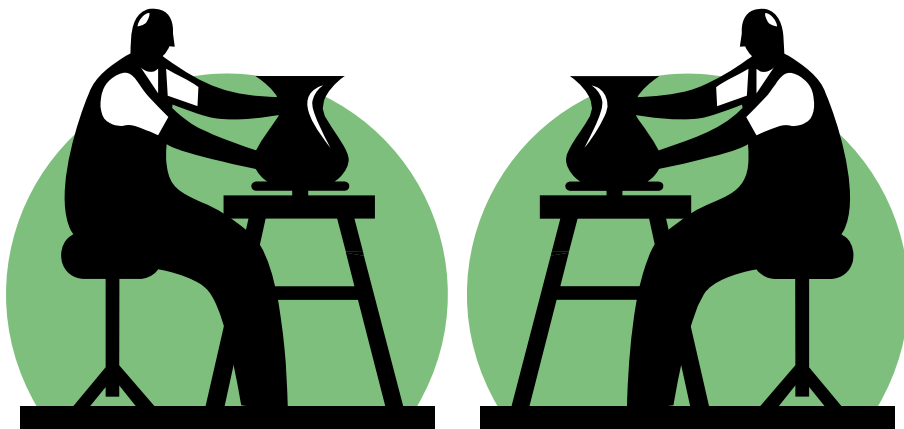

Please come and support this worthwhile charity that will help our community.

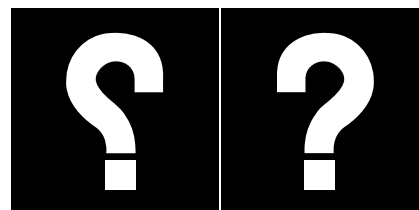


## CRIMSON TIMES NAMES STUDENT NEWSPAPER LEADERSHIP
