What do I have to do to start?

1. Attend registration. (Bring a government issued picture ID)
*If you are 16 or 17, please also bring a withdrawal form from your last high school and a parent or guardian must attend registration with you.
2. Take a test. (So you know what you need to work on. There's no pass or fail!)
3. Come to class Tuesday, February 28th.

Frequently Asked Questions

How old do you have to be to attend classes?

Free classes are available for anyone 16 and over with proper identification.

How long will it take to get my GED®?

Students who make the most progress, are those who apply themselves and attend class consistently, but the time it takes will vary. An assessment is done at registration to help students know what they need to work on.

What are the age requirements to take the test?

You must be 18 or over to register. If you are 16 or 17, you must attend free GED® classes first and obtain the underage approval from your instructor.

What if all I have is an expired ID?

You will have to bring an unexpired, government issued photo ID in order to attend classes.

What if I just want to take a practice test?

Go to <https://ged.com> to create an account and register to take the official practice tests.

How much does it cost to take the GED® tests?

The GED® is made up of four tests, each test is \$40.00.

Is there any help for test fees?

Scholarships are available for Adult Education students who are ready to take the GED and have financial need. Most scholarships are available only to students who live in Carroll, Coweta, Douglas, Haralson, Heard, Meriwether, or Troup County.

What if I want to go on to college after getting my GED®?

Students enrolled in free classes may also qualify to enroll in several certificate programs offered by West Georgia Technical College once they have passed two parts of the GED® tests, including welding, early childhood development, and business.
